Sign Making

Apprenticeship Level 3

An apprenticeship can be a smart, costeffective way of taking on a new recruit to work in your sign making or display business, or to help an existing member of staff to progress in their career as a sign maker.

This apprenticeship will cover design, production and installation of complex signs, using perspex, vinyl, plastic, metal and glass, to customer requirements.

At the end of their apprenticeship, your trainee will be able to work as a competent sign maker, sign designer, sign installation maintenance technician, or even quality control inspector in your team.

Key Areas of Study

Your trainee will study two qualifications as part of their apprenticeship: firstly, a Level 3 Diploma in Sign Making; secondly, a Level 3 NVQ in Sign Making.

Training, Tutoring and Assessment

The whole programme takes 24 months to complete. Your trainee will mainly learn on the job, but the apprenticeship also includes 20% off-the-job training. Throughout each of the two years, your trainee will spend four days a week working with you on site as a trainee sign maker and the other one day a week in College.

Whilst at College, your apprentice will receive training to cover the knowledge and skills elements of the qualifications.

The Diploma is assessed through unit theory tests and practical end tests carried out in the College workshop. The NVQ is assessed through a porfolio of evidence gathered in the workplace which demonstrates that apprentices cover the range of skills required for their qualification.

We will support you and your trainee through regular one-to-one visits by a trained assessor every six to eight weeks. These visits will cover one-to-one support and individual learning, as well as observations to assess your trainee's competencies in the workplace and a review of their portfolio of evidence.

Apprentice Entry Requirements

No previous qualifications are required, however trainees would benefit from having completed a Level 2 Sign Making course before undertaking this apprenticeship and should have a minimum Level 1 Functional Skills (or equivalents) in English, Maths and ICT. We will provide any Functional Skills tuition required.

At Level 3 it is expected that apprentices will have existing employment / experience within the industry.
