Higher Apprenticeship

Level 4

There are many roles in the construction and civil engineering industries that require good management skills.

This Higher Apprenticeship offers broad-based training suitable for experienced candidates who want to progress their careers in a number of potential roles:

- Site Manager – managing staff and budgets, ensuring contracts are delivered on time and to programme, responsible for hiring staff, deliveries, quality management and costs.
- Project Manager – operating the site in a safe and secure manner, providing management information for reports, assisting in client liaison meetings and sub-contractor meetings.
- Site Engineer – surveying and levelling sites, checking drawings and quantities to ensure accuracy, organising site facilities, monitoring work of sub-contractors and attending site meetings.

Once completed, your trainee will have the skills to manage staff, budgets, deliveries and quality management, as well as liaise with clients and oversee projects.

The HNC, which is a component of this course, has been validated and approved by the Institution of Civil Engineers and RICS.

Key Areas of Study

There are two qualifications within the apprenticeship: firstly, a Level 4 HNC Diploma in Construction which is the knowledge qualification; secondly, either a Level 4 NVQ in Construction and Building Services Management and Supervision (Sustainability) or a Level 4 NVQ in Construction Site Supervision which are the competency qualifications.

Your trainee will cover essential knowledge, skills and behaviours in both the diploma and the NVQ, together with pathways units. The menu of optional pathways is detailed below from which you and your trainee can select the areas of most importance to your organisation.

NVQ units

The Level 4 NVQ in Construction and Building Services Management and Supervision (Sustainability)

has four mandatory units:

- Monitoring Quality Standards in Construction and the Built Environment
- Monitoring Environmental Factors and Sustainability in Construction and the Built Environment
- Managing the Progress of Projects in Construction and the Built Environment
- Maintaining Systems for Health, Safety, Welfare and Environmental Protection in the Workplace

Plus the choice of one of the following pathways:

- Construction and the Built Environment
- Building Services

The Level 4 NVQ in Construction Site Supervision has six mandatory units:

- Maintaining Systems for Health, Safety, Welfare and Environmental Protection in the Workplace
- Assessing and Recommending Work Methods for Carrying Out Site Operations in the Workplace
- Planning Activities and Resources to Meet Work Requirements in the Workplace
- Co-ordinating and Organising the Control of Work in the Workplace
- Controlling Work Progress Against Agreed Programmes in the Workplace
- Allocating and Monitoring the Use of Plant, Equipment or Machinery in the Workplace

Plus a choice of one of the following pathways:

- Building and Civil Engineering
- Highways Maintenance and Repair
- Residential Development
- Conservation
- Demolition
- Tunnelling

HNC Diploma units

Mandatory units

- Individual project
- Construction technology
- Science and materials
- Construction practice management
- Legal and statutory responsibilities in construction
- Construction information (drawing, detailing, specification)

Plus two additional units agreed with the College.

Training, Tutoring and Assessment

The whole programme takes 24 months to complete. Over the two-year period, your trainee will spend four days a week working with you on site as a trainee and the other one day a week in College building their skills and knowledge.

Whilst at College, your trainee will receive training to cover the technical diploma units of the qualification.

The HNC diploma is assessed through practical tasks, written assignments and presentations.

For the NVQ, assessment involves building a portfolio of evidence gathered in the workplace which demonstrates that trainees cover the range of skills required for their qualification.

We will offer support to you and your trainee through regular one-to-one visits by a trained assessor every six to eight weeks. These visits will cover one-to-one support and individual learning, as well as observations to assess your trainee's competencies in the workplace and a review of their portfolio

Apprenticeship Entry Requirements

For this apprenticeship, candidates will need a Level 3 qualification in a construction related course or prior work experience in the sector. This apprenticeship is not suitable for trainees under 19.
