About the Course

This Level 2 Apprenticeship allows you to work on a construction site or domestic and commercial premises as a Solid Plasterer, applying wet finishes to walls, ceilings and floors to given specifications. Alternatively, you may find work as a Fibrous Plasterer, installing fibrous (decorative) plaster elements.

As part of the course you will complete the following qualifications:

- Level 2 Diploma in Plastering
- Level 2 NVQ in Plastering
- Functional Skills in English and Maths (if not previously achieved)

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For the duration of your apprenticeship (two years) you will spend four days a week working with an employer, on site, as an apprentice plasterer, and the other one day per week in college, building on the skills and knowledge you have learned.

Key Units

Level 2 Diploma

Students will studying the following mandatory units:

- Health, Safety and Welfare in Construction
- Principles of Building Construction, Information and Communication
- Applying Plastering Materials to Interiors
- Fixing Dry Lining and Plasterboards to Interiors

In addition, students will also choose two units from either the Solid or Fibrous route.

Solid

- Laying sand and cement screeds
- Applying plastering materials to external backgrounds

Fibrous

- Produce reverse moulds for fibrous work
- Casting and fixing fibrous plaster work

Level 2 NVQ

You will complete 3 mandatory units:

- Conforming to General Health, Safety and Welfare in the Workplace
- Conforming to Productive Working Practices in the Workplace
- Moving, Handling and Storing Resources in the Workplace

Students will also select two additional NVQ units from either the Solid or Fibrous route, depending on the type of work you are carrying out on site.

Entry Requirements

- 4 GCSEs at grade D or above (or equivalents)
- Existing employment / experience within the industry
