

SCHOOL AND COLLEGE OFFER

Experience Days

An Experience Day takes place at the college and gives students the opportunity to sample a range of curriculum areas throughout the day, or simply focus on one. We offer a range of informative and interactive sessions (which can be found on pages 7-11) that can be used to personalise your Experience Day. Shorter alternatives which are delivered over a morning or afternoon are also available on request.

You can use the sessions below to tailor your Experience Day:

Subject tasters

Curriculum-specific taster sessions allow students to gain first-hand experience of studying at degree level. A specialist from one of our curriculum areas will deliver a workshop on a subject of your choice.

Campus tours

We can give individual or group tours around a campus of your choice to enable students to see where they will be spending their time on campus. This can include our HE common room, Lavazza coffee shops, refectories, sports facilities, Revive Beauty Salon and The Silver Plate Restaurant.

Additional Learning Support

We are committed to ensuring students with additional needs receive the support they need to get the most out of their education. We have a dedicated team who can offer personal, one-to-one transition support for students with additional needs. This can include – but is not limited to - familiarising students with the campus and key tutors, subject tasters and application support for Disabled Students' Allowance. Higher and Degree Apprenticeships session

This session provides students with information about the growing popularity of Higher and Degree Apprenticeships. We cover all bases, including where, when and how to apply, the support that's available, wages and all other associated benefits.

Student Finance session

This interactive and practical session covers all aspects of student finance. We begin with a myth busting quiz to clear up the facts about tuition fees, maintenance loans and how repayment works. We finish by explaining how to apply and what documents are typically required to evidence applications.

HE at The Sheffield College

This session gives an overview of the Higher Education qualifications we offer, such as full Honours Degrees, Foundation Degrees, HNDs and Higher Apprenticeships. We will then discuss the benefits of studying a university level course with us; exploring our personal and financial support, facilities and fees.

BTEC to HE

Research shows that fewer BTEC students progress onto university level courses, despite being more likely than their A Level counterparts to gain first-class honours degrees. This session aims to increase confidence and battle misconceptions around BTEC qualifications. Case studies demonstrating progression from BTECs to HE are used and can be supported by a student ambassador who has progressed onto university study from BTEC qualifications.







Post-18 options

Most students have an idea of what a degree or an Apprenticeship entails, but what about everything else that's on offer? This session can cover a range of alternative pathways, such as Foundation Degrees, Top-ups and Higher National Certificates and Diplomas, or simply focus on one.

Personal Statement session

This practical session addresses the do's and don'ts when writing a personal statement. We will look at how statements can be structured and the type of content which can be included. Students will also be shown how to incorporate skills they have acquired and should leave the session with a few examples to give them a head start with their application.

Where can my subject take me?

This session explores careers related to a discipline of your choice, relevant labour market information and important factors for students to consider when choosing their next steps.

Degree or not Degree?

Want to go into a particular profession but unsure how to get there? This session covers a range of careers and the different pathways available in order to become qualified. By the end of the session students will have a greater understanding of which professions and career routes require a higher education qualification.

UCAS information session

This session explores the benefits of studying at university level and the factors to consider when researching a course and a place to study. We also cover important information relating to UCAS, including how to apply and key deadlines to be aware of.

Quiz a student

A current student will answer questions about life at The Sheffield College, what to expect at university level and any other questions you may have. Our student ambassador will explain the benefits of studying at the college and go into detail about the challenges and rewards of studying a higher education course.



OPEN DAYS


Our Open Days are the ideal way for prospective students to check out our facilities, speak to tutors and current students about our study programmes and find out what support we have available.
