As a governor, your insights, experience and ideas would widen our strategic perspective and help to shape the College's future development. At this time, we are keen to increase the diversity of the board to reflect more closely the communities the College serves, particularly in relation to ethnicity and age. Therefore, we strongly encourage expressions of interest from younger and from people from a BEM background.

The vacancy for new governors is available from August 2020. We are looking for people who:

- support the mission of the College and are confident about working at a strategic level;
- have insights, skills and experience, particularly in the sectors listed;
- enjoy engaging with young people and can commit some time to getting involved in the work of the College and
- are prepared to have their own activities as a governor scrutinised by colleague members of the Governing Body.

To complement the skills mix of the Board, we are interested (although not exclusively so) in expressions of interest from people with expertise in any of the following areas:

- senior experience in the FE and skills sector (not current College staff or students);
- professional qualification or equivalent experience in estates management or property development;
- professional qualification or experience at a senior level in Human Resources;
- a qualified solicitor or someone with comparable legal qualification or paralegal experience.

Appointments to the Governing Body are for two years in the first instance with the likelihood of extension to four years by mutual agreement. Being a governor is a voluntary role so there is no remuneration other than reasonable out of pocket expenses. Governors typically commit on average between one to two days of effort per month to the College. We recognise that Governors differ widely in their availability and we strive to ensure that busy people can nevertheless make an effective contribution to the Board.
