5 reasons to choose Sheffield

During your time in Sheffield you certainly won't be short of a thing or two to do. In fact, there's absolutely loads you can do whilst you are here.

1.

Sport activities

We love all sports in Sheffield! There are loads of opportunities to see football matches at Bramall Lane or Hillsborough Stadium, practise your swimming at our International Sport Centre or go ice skating. The Sheffield College has excellent on-site sport facilities available as well as a mini-gym. Students can play table tennis, badminton, football, handball, volleyball and basketball every week.

Go shopping

Take the tram from The Sheffield College to access Meadowhall shopping centre in just 20 minutes! Enjoy nature

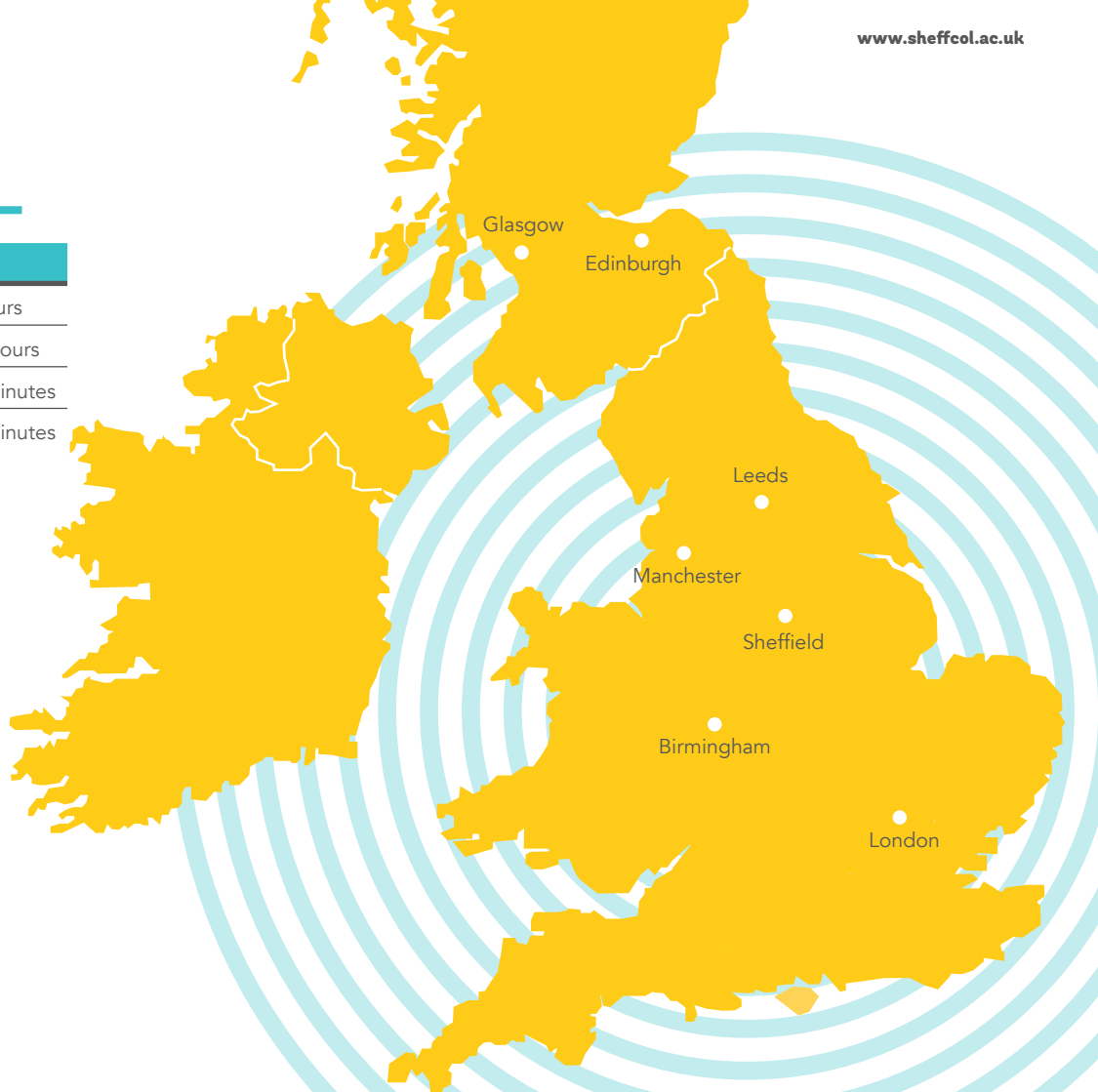

A safe environment for 16 & 17 year old students

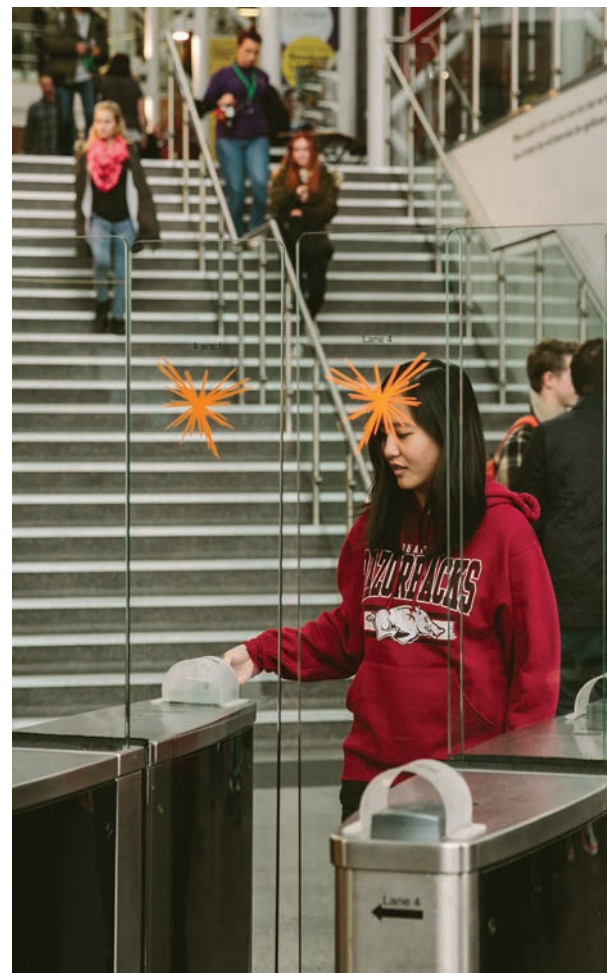
The Sheffield College has secure facilities — each student accesses the college through security gates via the use of their student card and has to sign in and out of the building.

Classes are open to all ages. During break times, students go to our city diner or in the college hall where there are always college staff present.

If the student has a problem, teachers and the International Office Team are always available to provide advice and support regarding any welfare or safeguarding issue, including bullying, family or financial problems.

Parents receive reports regarding their child's progress and any concerns they may have during their time at The Sheffield College.

Students receive an emergency mobile number to contact us during evenings, weekends and holidays.



Studying English in Sheffield

Our general English programme allows you to improve your skill areas, such as reading, writing, listening and speaking, using the latest course books and materials. All our classrooms are equipped with interactive white boards and mini white boards.

In addition, you will be encouraged to develop your vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation as well as study skills, strategies and autonomous learning.

You will:

- study 18 hours per week
- receive Tutor Mentor support 1.5 hours per week
- prepare and give class presentations
- carry out surveys
- compile results in written and spoken form
- improve your writing skills by producing formal and informal texts

- Funfairs and theme parks



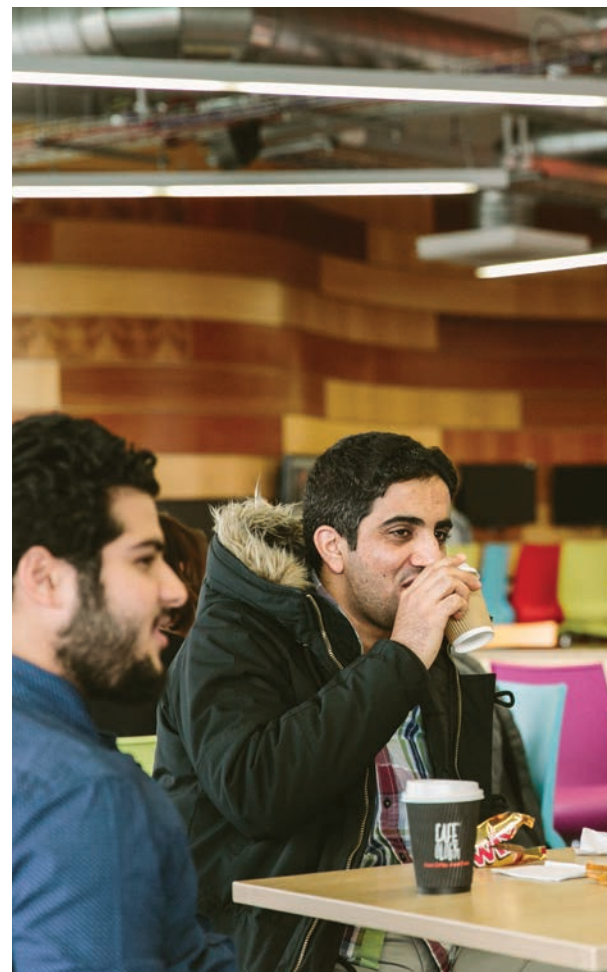
Cost of living

Not only is Sheffield a fantastic city in which to live, it is also very affordable with prices lower than the national average and a lot lower than in London. Even though prices are affordable, how much you spend during your time here will ultimately be down to you.

Here are some example costs of essentials you may need to buy on a regular basis:

Travel

Travel to The Sheffield College is extremely easy, wherever and however you are getting to us. Our City Campus, where you will be spending most of your time, is just a 10 minute walk from the train station and has a tram and bus stop right outside. If you are living with a host family, they will never be further than half an hour away from us on public transport.

By bus

Being so close to the city centre, you're spoilt for choice when it comes to bus travel to college. The central bus station is only a 10 minute walk away and the 120 bus travelling to/from Crystal Peaks stops just two minutes outside our City Campus.

By train

Sheffield Train Station is only a 10 minute walk from our City Campus and provides excellent connections to nearby towns and cities that are further afield.

By tram

The Sheffield College has its very own tram stop right outside our City Campus called Granville Road/The Sheffield College. Trams stop here approximately every 10 minutes and provide access to the whole city.

Trams heading towards Halfway (Blue Line) stop right outside the college, whilst those coming from the opposite direction (heading towards Malin Bridge) stop just across the road.

Travel to the rest of the country

We know that during your time in the UK you won't just want to stay in Sheffield. Just as easy as it is to get to The Sheffield College by public transport, it's also as easy to visit any of the major cities in the UK for a day or the weekend. You can access any of the major cities by train or coach, although it is quicker to travel by train. Here are some examples of single ticket prices and how long it will take you to get there:

As train prices are quite expensive, it is worth **booking tickets in advance** as discounts are often applied.



Accommodation

At the college we work hard to ensure that your stay is as enjoyable and rewarding as possible. That includes being in accommodation which you find comfortable, enjoyable and safe.

Many of our International students prefer to stay with a family, known as homestay accommodation, when they first come to England as this gives them an opportunity to learn more about the British way of life, as well as a chance to practise their English.

Living with a host family in a homestay has many benefits. You will be treated like a full member of the household, eating together and sharing common living areas.

The Sheffield College meets all host families before students move in and informs them as to what is expected from them.

There are two options available when living in homestay accommodation:

Half board

- Bed
- Breakfast
- Evening meal
- All meals at weekends

Full board

- Bed
- Breakfast
- Lunch
- Evening meal
- All meals at weekends

Students will have their own bedroom and will sometimes share a bathroom with the host family. The Sheffield College will inform you if you are expected to share the bedroom with another student in your homestay.

The International Office will arrange homestay accommodation for you prior to your arrival in Sheffield. You must fill in an accommodation form when you apply for a course and send it to the International Office.

Rented accommodation

Although The Sheffield College does not own any residential accommodation, there are many independent living options students may choose (not suitable for under 18s).

- Self-catering student accommodation
- Students halls

In this type of accommodation the length of agreement is normally a minimum of six months or for the whole of the academic year. Accommodation is normally in clusters of flats with your own study-bedroom, sharing communal facilities with other flatmates.



Visa applications

If you want to study in the UK and at The Sheffield College, it is possible that you will need to get a visa to allow you to do so. People who are nationals of an European Economic Area (EEA) country or Switzerland can enter the UK as a student without a visa, but everyone else must obtain one.

There are a couple of different types of visa. The visa that you will need depends on your age and how long you are planning on coming to the UK to study for. So which do you need?



Short-term student visa (6 months)

If you are over 18 years old and are intending to come to the UK for a maximum of 6 months, this is the visa you will need to apply for. When you apply for this visa, The Sheffield College will issue you with a supporting letter for your application.

Up to 6 months
English courses

Short-term student visa (11 months)

If you are over 18 years old and are intending to come to the UK for a maximum of 11 months, this is the visa you will need to apply for. When you apply for this visa, The Sheffield College will issue you with a supporting letter for your application.

Up to 11 months
English courses

Short-term student visa (child)

If you are aged 16 or 17 years old and are intending to come to the UK for a maximum of 6 months, this is the visa you will need to apply for. When you apply for this visa, The Sheffield College will issue you with a supporting letter for your application.

Up to 6 months

Health surcharge

To be able to access the National Health Service (NHS) in the same way as a permanent UK resident, non-EEA nationals who apply to come to the UK to study for more than 6 months will need to pay the Immigration Health Surcharge. To check how much Immigration Health Surcharge you will need to pay, please consult: www.immigration-health-surcharge.service.gov.uk/checker/type

Please ensure that you apply for your visa in your current country of residency and leave enough time for it to arrive before flying to the UK (approx. 3 months).
