## **Veterinary Nursing**

# Apprenticeship Level 3

An apprenticeship can be a smart, costeffective way of taking on a new recruit to work in your veterinary practice, or to train up an existing member of staff.

This apprenticeship will prepare your trainee to become a professional Registered Veterinary Nurse (RVN). The trainee will learn how to assist veterinary surgeons during surgery, administer medicine, monitor anaesthetics, perform x-rays, care for inpatients, clean cages and kennels and infection control, as well as advise clients on pet care, take phone calls and make appointments.

At the end of their apprenticeship, your trainee will be able to work as a competent Registered Veterinary Nurse in your team and should be in a position to develop their career.

## **Key Areas of Study**

As part of the apprenticeship, your trainee will study for a City & Guilds Level 3 Diploma in Veterinary Nursing.

Your trainee will cover essential knowledge, skills and competencies in the diploma through a series of core units.

## **Training, Tutoring and Assessment**

The whole programme takes 24 months to complete with two distinct elements to the diploma; practical skills and knowledge. Your apprentice will mainly learn on the job, but the apprenticeship also includes 20% off-the-job training. Throughout each of the two years, your trainee will spend four days a week working with you on site developing their practical skills and the other one day a week in College learning the theory and developing their knowledge.

Theory and knowledge is assessed by online examinations, assignments and case studies. The practical aspect of the diploma is assessed using an online training tool called the Nursing Progress Log (NPL) to provide evidence of practical training and competency. To assist the trainee with this they will need a designated mentor (clinical coach) in the work place. At the end of the diploma, trainees complete a final practical examination (OSCEs).

We will support you and your trainee through regular one-to-one visits by a trained assessor every six to eight weeks. These visits will cover one-to-one support and individual learning, as well as observations to assess your trainee's competencies in the workplace and a review of their portfolio of evidence. We will also provide full training and ongoing support to mentors in practice.

## **Apprentice Entry Requirements**

Apprentices will be required to have 5 x GCSEs with minimum Grades C / 4 (or equivalents), including English Language, Maths and Science, prior to being accepted onto this apprenticeship. In addition if they haven't done so already, apprentices must achieve Level 2 Functional Skills in English and Maths. We will provide any English and Maths tuition required. Experience in the industry would be beneficial but is not essential.

## **Future/Other Opportunities**

Higher Education courses are available such as the Advanced Diploma in Veterinary Nursing and Degree (BSc). Many Registered Veterinary Nurses will go on to 'top-up' their qualifications.

There is also an array of post-qualification professional certificates in specialist areas that can be achieved once qualified such as Emergency & Critical Care, Exotics, Practice/Business Management, Hydrotherapy and Behaviour to name a few!
