About the Course

This Level 3 Apprenticeship prepares you for working on a construction site or in domestic and commercial premises applying wet finishes to walls, ceilings and floors and carrying out complex work to given specifications, or installing fibrous plaster elements to complex specifications.

As part of the course you will complete the following qualifications:

- Level 3 Diploma in Plastering
- Level 3 NVQ in Plastering
- Functional Skills in English and Maths (if not previously achieved)

For the duration of your apprenticeship (one year) you will spend four days a week working with an employer, on site as an apprentice plasterer, and the other one day per week in college building on the skills and knowledge you have learned.

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Key Units

Level 3 Diploma Units

There are 3 mandatory units in the Diploma:

- Health, Safety and Welfare in Construction
- Principles of Organising, Planning and Pricing Construction Work
- Running In-situ Moulds

And 2 optional units in either:

- Applying Plastering Materials to Detailed Interiors
- Applying Plastering Materials to Detailed Exteriors OR
- Producing Reverse Moulds for Detailed Fibrous Plaster and Cement Casting
- Producing and Fixing Detailed Fibrous Plaster and Cement Casts

Level 3 NVQ Units

You will complete 6 mandatory units:

- Conforming to General Health, Safety and Welfare in the Workplace
- Confirming the Occupational Method of Work in the Workplace
- Confirming Work Activities and Resources for an Occupational Work Area
- Producing Complex Internal Solid Plastering Finishes in the Workplace
- Producing Complex External Rendering Finishes in the Workplace
- Developing and Maintaining Good Occupational Working Relationships in the Workplace

Plus 1 optional unit, determined by the type of work you carry out on site.

Entry Requirements

- Minimum of Level 1 Functional Skills (or equivalents) in English and Maths
- Existing employment / experience within the industry

If you are not already employed within the industry you will need to find a suitable employer to complete your apprenticeship with.
