About the Course

It is likely that you will be working in a small to medium sized vehicle maintenance and repair establishment. You will be undertaking a variety of supervised tasks, and your duties will vary depending on where you work. You might be working in a service technician type role, carrying out routine maintenance and basic repairs, as well as identifying and reporting faults on engines, steering and suspension, brakes, transmission and the electrical systems. You will also cover health and safety in the workplace and use of tools. Each vehicle will present new challenges and it is really important to have good communication skills to be able to explain everything to the customer.

The day you are in college you will be doing some workshop sessions in the College workshop working on light or heavy vehicles. You will be given tasks to complete as part of your portfolio. The technical sessions will give you the basic knowledge, teach you new skills and help prepare you for your exams.

The course consists of a minimum of 30 hours per week, which includes a one day a week attendance at college. Functional skills in English and Maths also form an important part of your course, there will be exams when you are ready.

You are encouraged to look for your own placement. The College will help to find a suitable placement but the emphasis is on you.
