



Dear applicant,

As part of the induction process on to Level 3 Hairdressing, you will be required to complete a range of tasks over the summer. You will need to bring this project completed on your first day of term to be marked.

Hair colouring is one of the most exciting, creative, and imaginative processes performed in the salon. It is individualistic, as each client looks and reacts differently to colour.

TASK 1 - PRODUCE A FACT SHEET

Candidates are required to:

- Describe the effects that colouring and lightening products have on the hair structure
- Explain how natural hair pigmentation affects colour selection
- Explain how the international colour chart is used to select colour
- State what 'percentage and volume strength hydrogen peroxide' means
- Explain the dangers associated with inhalation of powder lighteners
- Explain the importance of carrying out tests, prior to and during the colouring process, and recording the results

TASK 2 – RESEARCH AND PRODUCE A CHART

Candidates are required to research and state remedial actions for the following colouring problems in the form of a chart:

Correction requirements identified during consultation:

- Base colour is too dark
- Base colour is too light
- Colour is fading too quick
- Colouring resistant hair
- Restoring depth and tone
- Neutralising colour tone

Colour problems identified during the colour service:

- Incorrect colour result
- Adverse reaction
- Seepage
- Hair deterioration

TASK 3 – CREATE A MOOD BOARD

Candidates are required to design a mood board to represent seasonal hair colours:

- Choose a season – Spring/Summer OR Autumn/Winter.
 - Create a mood board of inspirational colours for your chosen seasonal trend this can be either A4 or A3 in size.
 - You can use pictures, writing, fabric, glitters, photos of your work and anything else you think will compliment your seasonal colour trend.
 - Your mood board does not need to be flat; it can be 3D if you wish to attach bigger items to it.
