



Careers Support - guide for parents and carers

These days, young people have ever-increasing choices about their future careers and the different routes to get there. Along with a competitive jobs market, this can make it difficult but important for them to make the right choices around education/training and employment.

High quality careers information, advice and guidance (IAG) becomes crucial in helping them make decisions about their future. As a team of professionally qualified careers advisers, we offer this IAG through a range of career-related activities. As impartial advisers we also work with a range of local employers and education providers to make sure that our students are well-informed about different progression options available to them.

Here is a summary of the ways in which we support students to make decisions about their future:

Impartial Personal Careers Guidance

Faced with a wide range of options at different stages of their education or training, we aim to encourage our learners to use a range of methods to explore the careers that will be interesting to them and the different possible routes to get there so that they can make informed choices about their next steps.

How to access this support?

We have a dedicated team of qualified and impartial careers advisers at each campus who are on hand throughout students' time at college. One-to-one personal careers appointments can be booked by the student themselves at any point or through staff referral. We also offer guidance through interactive group sessions and virtual settings.

Progression support

At important transition points, we help students explore suitable education or training routes based on their interests, needs and preferred way of learning. This support is offered through group information and guidance sessions as well as through events where we invite a wide range of employers, training providers and educational institutions to present their opportunities.

As we offer impartial careers IAG, we support students to explore both internal and external progression options including the following:

- Study Programmes - offer the chance to study a full-time programme with a college or training provider, gaining qualifications (e.g. A Levels, BTECs) while completing maths and English qualifications if needed
- Apprenticeships - offer the opportunity to combine paid employment with studying for a professional qualification in a wide range of industry sectors

- Traineeships/Employability Study Programmes - offer short term work placements as preparation for the world of work by providing the necessary experience to join an apprenticeship or employment
