# **OUR ACTIVITIES**

### What do you want to be? An introduction to post-16 options

Recommended for Year 7

Exploring career aspirations. Within this presentation students will explore the curriculum areas on offer at The Sheffield College and the courses available to help them achieve their career goals. The session will also highlight the differences between school and college life and help students to understand the many post-16 options that are available to them.

Recommended for years 8 & 9

### What is an Apprenticeship?

Recommended for years 9, 10 & 11

Available all year round, this informative session provides students with information, tips and advice about the growing popularity of Apprenticeships. We cover everything you need to know about Apprenticeships including the different standards and levels, how to find one, how to apply, wages and support. We also discuss our free Apprenticeship recruitment service and how students can access this.

### University level study presentation

Recommended for years 10, 11, 12 & 13

This is a session providing an introduction to university level qualifications, including how and where they can be studied. Students will gain information about the types of post-16 options available and which have progression pathways that are available at university level. This session aims to raise aspirations and widen the participation of students studying at a higher level.

### **College tours**

Recommended for years 7 to 11

Available all year round, college tours are a great way of getting students familiarised with the college environment and are ideal for students who are undecided about their post-16 options.
